1. fool (n.): someone who is or has done something unwise

例句: I've been such a fool.

	April Fools' Day	

“To make a fool of someone” is an expression that means to act in such a way that the person is considered foolish or stupid.

例句: Last night I made a fool of myself when I forgot to bring my report to the meeting.

fool (v.): to trick someone

例句: We were fooled by her innocent appearance and trusted her completely.

April Fool's Day (愚人節): a day in which people would play pranks on or lie to each other

例句: April Fools' Day is widely celebrated in the western countries on the first day of April.

foolish (adj.): stupid, unwise

例句：I did a lot of foolish things when I was young.

2. page (n.): one of the leaves of a publication or other written document

例句：Please turn to page 25 of our textbook.

page (v.)	page (n.)	

on the same page: an expression that indicates that everyone involved in a project or event is in sync with each other. They will have the same information and probably share the same opinions with one another.

例句：I read your email, and I am pretty sure we are all on the same page, and so the project will definitely be a success!

page (v.): When someone is paged, that usually means that the person is beeped or called to an important meeting or business encounter.

例句：Doctors who are off the clock (下班) often are paged back to work if they are needed in emergency situations.

3. roll (v.): to move in a circular motion, like a wheel

例句：The ball rolled downhill onto the pavement.

Get the ball rolling refers to a situation where someone starts an event so that progress can be made towards completing a project.

例句: Now that we've decided on the details, why don't we get the ball rolling and start on our project?
