1. to have a point – When someone says something that makes sense or with which you agree, you can say "you have a point," meaning "that is correct."

例句: I understand you. You do have a point. It is unsafe to go biking during a typhoon.

## 2. I'll get back to you

解析:It means that I'll let you know later; I'll get in touch with you later. In our script, it means "I'll get you the materials later."

例句: If your friend asks you something and you don't know the answer, you can say "I'll get back to you." It means that you will find out the answer and then tell your friend.

### 3. Keep (someone) posted

解析:It is to keep someone updated. To provide someone with the latest information can keep someone posted.

例句: During typhoons, the weather bureau issues hourly typhoon updates to keep us posted on the latest typhoon developments.

#### 4. Thanks a bunch

解析: An informal expression meaning "thanks a lot."

例句: Thanks a bunch for the present that you sent me last Christmas.
